
I am delighted to introduce to you the upcoming Ph.D. graduates of the Columbia School of Social Work.

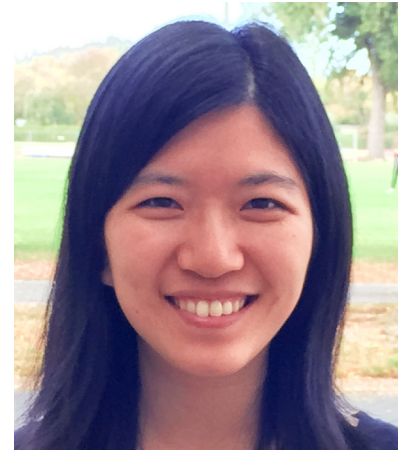
